Dear <parent>

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family safe and well.

I am writing to update you on the Careers Programme and where you can find information relating to Careers Education at St John Henry Newman Catholic School.

#### **Careers Week**

The last week of every half term is a careers themed week. In every subject area, teachers will devote a small portion of their subject time to teaching about the different careers their subject area can open. During Form Time, tutors will explore a company with their Form looking at the varying roles and operations that exist within different companies.

I have enclosed the timetable detailing the careers that will be explored over the coming week with this letter, so you can discuss with <name> the careers they have explored in school.

#### **School Website**

On our website, if you click on **students > careers > parents** you will be taken to a page that has a wealth of information for you to explore with <name>. As well as there being a 'Labour Market Widget' (a tool that allows you to explore jobs and their salaries) there is also an information booklet with further information relating to supporting your child in making important choices at different milestones in their school life from Year 8 right through to 6<sup>th</sup> Form.

## **Labour Market Information**

The quarterly labour market information published by the local authority is updated with regularity on our main Careers page on the school website. I have enclosed the March LMI with this newsletter for your convenience. The document is quite complex, however the sections that I would encourage you to explore with <name> are pages 13 to 15 and 16 to 19. This will give you and <name> an overview of the importance of securing next steps in Further Education and the type of jobs and skills that are in demand in Cumbria presently.

#### START Profile www.startprofile.com

Our school invests heavily in a website called START Careers Profile. All our students have a log in for the website and can explore Careers at their leisure. There is a wealth of information on START, including short videos from employers and employees talking about their individual experiences. I encourage you to have a look on there with <name> if they have a career that they are interested in.

## **Subject Specific Guidance**

To further compliment our use of START, on the students section of the school website, there are resource booklets for every subject area. Within these booklets, there are concise pages that give students an overview of the types qualifications different subject areas lead onto. These are particularly useful to arm yourself and <name> with clear knowledge of next steps at important transition points including Guided Choices, Further Education and Higher Education. The links to the documents can be found on the website by clicking **students** > **careers** > **students**.

#### **Career of the Week**

Sometimes for students, despite coaxing and guidance, it can be a real challenge to see themselves in a future career role. This is perfectly normal and is universally acknowledged as being so amongst Careers Advice and Guidance specialists. To help provide an extra flavour of variety, we have a Career of the Week on the website. Click on **students > careers > career of the week** to have a look.

#### **Careers Advice and Guidance**

Both myself and Mrs Brookes are qualified Careers Specialists. I hold a PGCE in Careers Strategy & Leadership, and Mrs Brookes has a Diploma in delivering Careers Advice and Guidance. That means we are well positioned to deliver a vibrant careers programme underpinned by impartial Careers Advice and Guidance.

In addition to offering every Year 11 and 13 student a Careers interview, we work in close partnership with INSPIRA to ensure our vulnerable students in Years 9 – 13 and those with an EHCP have a clear plan to secure appropriate 'next steps' at every step of the way. We involve the HOY and SENDCo Mrs Graham in this process as well, to ensure joined-up thinking and communication.

For guided choices, Mrs Brookes will meet with students with an EHCP and their parents, to offer additional support and guidance.
